Upon arriving back into the USA on March 4 after five weeks in Guyana, South America, the balance of the month was given over to catching up on matters delayed by our absence. We continued to downsize as we attempted to combine our two homes into one dwelling. We gave items away to our neighbors, to family and to various charities. For months yet, we put things away and applied our décor to nearly every open floorspace and wall area. Recently, our next-door neighbor gasped as she walked across the threshold to our front door. She exclaimed, “Dusting! Think of all the things that will need dusted!”

For months also, we continued to repair and adjust various little things at our newly acquired domicile. The To-Do List seems unending; I keep thinking that eventually we will be “moved in and settled” to the point that we can simply relax. However, I’m doubtful that will ever actually happen.

Since our return to the USA and to Florida, Martha and I have had a non-ending schedule of appointments with doctors of various kinds. Apparently, we’re getting older and some body parts don’t work as well as they used to, and reoccurring pain is a daily challenge for each of us.

Formerly, I traveled up to 40 weeks or parts of weeks a year, stateside and abroad. Though we have reduced the number of weeks “on the road,” we still find opportunity to travel in the United States and in foreign countries. Much of April and May were consumed with a 20-day trip to various states here in America. We attended the India Missions Conference and a missionary retreat. We hauled about two tons of literature to Nashville, Tennessee for shipment to Guyana, and we hauled some remaining possessions back to Florida. We traveled to or through Florida, Mississippi, Tennessee, Alabama and Georgia. Along the way, our trip was punctuated with speaking appointments at several churches of Christ. We returned to our Ocala, Florida home on May 7.

May 26, Martha and I departed once more for a stateside trek, which took us to appointments in Florida, Georgia, Tennessee, Kentucky, Ohio and West Virginia. Additionally, we visited family in Pennsylvania and New York. This journey spanned 17 days.

Since our last newsletter, we have continued to publish the monthly Internet magazine, *Gospel Gazette Online*. In addition, we have been able to prepare for publication another quarterly issue of *The Voice of Truth International*. 📖

This year, we will also need to secure funds to permit brother Milo to come on the mission trip, too. Financial arrangements must be made about two months ahead of our departure, and we are leaving October 3<sup>rd</sup>. Therefore, it is imperative that we begin gathering the necessary money as soon as possible. 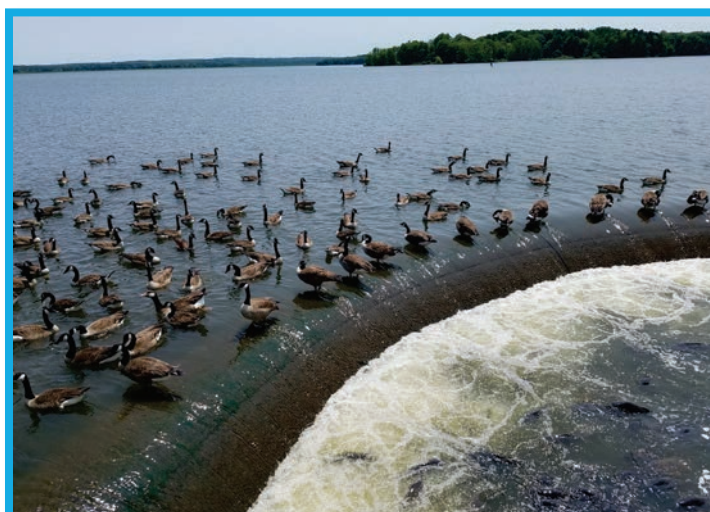
