Covid-19 Consequences

No one knew what the ramifications or the consequences of Covid-19 would be when it surfaced in late 2019 and early 2020. Skeptics and conspiracy theorists aside (including our children, perhaps representative of their generation), people far and near are dying because of Covid-19. I just learned that the sister and brother-in-law of the preacher, for the church with which we worship, died of Covid yesterday and today respectively. I know a preacher and his wife in Texas who contracted Covid; he recovered, but she died. A few days ago, one of the most influential Gospel preachers in Myanmar or Burma died of Covid, and others are sick with that disease. Especially, India has been devastated by Covid-19, resulting in mass outdoor cremations, as well as dumping bodies in rivers. Some of our children have had Covid and recovered, for which we are thankful, of course.

The Covid-19 pandemic paralyzed the world, and many nations locked their citizens down – ruining their economies in a desperate attempt to snuff out the virus. Wave after wave of Covid-19, including more deadly and contagious strains, continue to batter humanity. The final toll on mankind has not yet been realized.

Naturally, the Lord's church and foreign missions have also suffered and still reel from the effects of Covid-19. Worldwide, most churches of Christ decreased the number of assemblies or curtailed them for a time altogether. Practically, every home in which Christians lived became a small congregation of God's people, inclusive of family members and perhaps other brethren living nearby. At times, Martha and I worshipped in our home, and sometimes, some of her children and grandchildren worshipped with us, too.

Travel abroad, as well as stateside reporting to churches, stopped. Many international borders are still closed as various nations battle Covid-19. Jerry and Paula Bates, coworkers of ours, were able to make multiple trips to African nations by avoiding Europe and Asia; they have also resumed reporting to stateside churches. Martha and I have lately begun to report to churches, too. We also ventured out to the Maywood Missionary Retreat outside of Hamilton, Alabama, and more recently, Martha and I participated in the annual World Evangelism Team Meeting in Winona, Mississippi.

Besides cautiously beginning to travel in the states, Martha and I, along with coworkers, have not ceased publishing *Gospel Gazette Online* and *The Voice of Truth International* magazines. Though *The Voice of Truth International* is a quarterly journal in printed form, one may view it as a PDF by selecting the link for the Digital Library in the last line of the masthead for *Gospel Gazette Online* (www.GospelGazette.com). All 110 editions of VOTI and dozens of book PDFs are there for anyone without charge.

Shipping companies remained active despite Covid-19 and were busier because of the pandemic. This enabled us not to experience any interruption in sending literature to Guyana, South America. Preparing for the next shipment in October, I bought forty large print NKJV Bibles and 3,000 communion cups. We'll put with that, one hundred of my most recent sermon outline book, *Preaching the Whole Counsel of God to the Whole World, Vol. 4.* It is primarily full sentence sermon outlines highlighting Christian living and Christian service. Volume 1 was about Deity, primarily lessons concerning Jesus Christ. Volume 2 treats Bible authority, and the third volume con-

cerns the church of our Lord. These sermon outlines will bolster particularly foreign brethren who may find themselves thrust unprepared into the roles of Gospel preachers, evangelists and teachers. Anyone, however, can benefit from the sermon books, even stateside.

Back issues and current editions of The Voice of Truth International magazine are a primary part of all of my shipments to Guyana. Our Guyanese brethren need tracts also for edification and evangelism.

When possible, Martha and I will resume foreign mission trips. **India** is closed to travel on tourist visas (which we must use) until Covid-19 has run its course or has been satisfactorily contained. Myanmar is out of control, both with uncontrolled Covid-19 and the military overthrow of the government, resulting in massive unrest. The military has killed about 1,000 protesters and imprisoned nearly 10,000 others. Further, it has criminalized doctors and nurses because they also marched in protest of the coup. Hence, health care is in shambles as medical professionals have fled clinics and hospitals. For seven decades a limited civil war has been ongoing between the government and tribal holdouts who refuse to submit to Burmese dominance. Now, with protesters who determine to fight back against the military, who are being trained and armed by the tribal army, guerrilla warfare or a much wider civil war may occur. Of the places to which Martha and I ordinarily travel, Guyana remains a hopeful destination for our annual series of workshops in February 2022.

Though unable in 2021 to go personally to India, Myanmar and Guyana, I remain a facilitator for ongoing evangelistic work, especially in India and Guyana. Several thousand dollars were conveyed to brethren in India to print thousands of books and tracts in the Telugu language. I sent thousands of dollars more also to India for a Hindi language television program aired in New Delhi, India. Many thousands of dollars were directed to Guyana for the series of workshops and a television program. Since the official language of Guyana is English, as mentioned earlier, we are able to send quite a bit of literature and Bibles to brethren in that country. Beyond that, I correspond with brethren via email in thirty-four countries.

Martha and I are not idle, despite travel curtailments that we have experienced between March 2, 2020 when we returned from Guyana and the present. With your prayers, encouragement and financial participation, we **press on**, and will do so, until we **pass on**. Thank you.

Guyana Television Programs

My dear friend and our brother in Christ, Nigel Milo, is a very talented, experienced and ambitious servant

of God. He has determined to live in his home country of Guyana, though some of his family members have migrated to the USA. Many Guyanese immigrate to other countries in the Caribbean, the United States, Canada or England to escape one of the poorer nations in the world. However, brother Nigel is determined to remain in Guyana as long as he can be a productive Gospel preacher and evangelist.

In 2020, funding ran out for both of the television programs on which brother Milo was preaching the Gospel. His programs aired in the capital city of Georgetown and in the second most prominent city in the country, Linden, where he, his wife and son reside. As a temporary and partial remedy for the unfunded TV programs, I was able to divert unspent money for the national workshops to finance one of the television programs for one year.

Dear Reader, can you or the congregation where you worship help pay for a television program? One program in Georgetown, which will reach most of the country, including Linden, costs about \$600 per Jasmine Milo; Berna Allicock (Jasmine's mother) month or \$7,200 per year. In addition, we need to es-

tablish a robust webpage to coincide with the TV program, including past episodes and offering Christian literature. Then, there is the literature that we must purchase or print to meet the needs of follow-up and outreach. It would be wonderful if we could raise \$10,000 for the TV program, the website and follow-up literature. We will appreciate any part of that goal with which you could help, and you will make a significant impact on the small country of Guyana, South America. Notes from Overseas

Vinay David: New Delhi, India – Our church building is still locked for over a month now. Due to lockdown, we are still worshipping in our homes. I am really missing the gathering and the fellowship. Some of our members got sick, but they are much better now, and are on the road to recovery. Overall, the church in Delhi is doing fine. In February 2021, an older person obeyed the Lord, and then in March 2021, a lady obeyed the Lord. TV program is running fine. ...I am still able to garner requests for Bible courses, Hindi Bibles, Bible magazines and other Hindi biblical literature. I also sent 8 big boxes weighing a total of 800 pounds, containing 25,000 Hindi tracts, 100 Bibles and 1,000 different biblical books to preachers working in the Hindi belt area.

Joshua Gootam: Kakinada, India – There are 1,000s of dead bodies floating in the Ganges these days in India. The situation in our country and especially in our state is very FRIGHT-ENING due to the second wave of Covid. Literally millions have lost their lives and millions more are being affected on a daily basis. Kakinada is under lockdown for nearly a month now. You are allowed to move only from 8 a.m. to 12 noon. Kakinada is worst affected. Almost every home is affected here, and daily you hear of people dying that you know. In our home, Robin and his wife were victims all last month. Robin spent a fortnight in the hospital and got out of it alive only by God's grace. Rachel his wife had to be quarantined in the next-door house for nearly 3 weeks. She had to fight for her life and at the same time take care of Ryan (4 yrs) and Jordan (1 yr) all by herself. Robin was struggling in the hospital at the same time. ... We had to close our office for ten days to prevent the staff from getting exposed, and yet, one Hindu gentleman opposite the church building died Sunday morning. People are dying for want of Oxygen to breathe. However, our office reopened on 24th Monday morning and are working under closed doors. The church continues to meet at 8 a.m. Sundays secretly in spite of the government's orders to close down. The numbers are depleted as many prefer to break bread in their homes. We lost one or two members as they succumbed to the virus. We also lost many members and preachers in this state.
