# Maintaining Foreign Commitments in 2022

Louis Rushmore

With your prayers, moral support and financial participation, Martha and I hope to maintain our foreign commitments in 2022. Since the pandemic began nearly two years ago, our expenses exceed monetary gifts from both individual and congregational donors. Of course, we cannot continue to spend more than we receive, but we view 2022 with a measure of optimism.

Circumstances abroad, sadly, sometimes hamper *business as usual*. Covid-19 resurgence in overseas nations, as well as in the USA, necessitate a constant vigilance and flexibility. **India** is beginning to open itself to foreign visitors in stages with restrictions. **Myanmar** is crippled with not only Covid-19 but nationwide demonstrations and civil unrest following the military overthrow of the democratic government in February 2021. American missionaries are traveling now to and throughout **Guyana** (South America). India, Myanmar (historically visited each year in the fall) and Guyana (usually visited annually in the winter) are the countries Martha and I have visited most often. We sometimes worship with and participate in Bible classes with brethren in **Singapore**. In addition, I have traveled in the past to **Sri Lanka** and worshipped with brethren there.

### Our 2022 Goals for India

- Continue to facilitate funds for one **Hindi language television program** broadcast from New Delhi; provide for follow-up **literature and postage**: \$20,000.
- Continue to provide funds for the **printing and distribution of Telugu language literature**, as well as for the purchase of **Telugu Bibles**: \$5,000 (considerably less than in previous years).

### Our 2022 Goals for Guyana

- Continue funding the **nationwide workshops** to prepare Guyanese brethren to be better able to both edify themselves and to evangelize their own country: \$22,000.
- Continue funding and perhaps to expand the reach of a **Guyanese television pro-gram**: \$5,000.
- Continue shipping and distribution of literature and Bibles: \$4,000.

### Our 2022 Goal for New Printing

• **Preaching the Whole Counsel of God to the Whole World**, volume 5, will be ready for publication in 2022. This series represents sermons I preached over nearly 50 years. Like topics appear together in the volumes (unlike, of course, the way in which they were presented over five decades). Full-sentence outlines with ample Scripture references permit readers to know clearly the lesson at hand and where to find the biblical evidence. This is particularly useful for brethren in some overseas places who may have little Bible background but find themselves called upon to preach and teach God's Word: \$3,500.

Every gift is greatly appreciated, and if a gift is stipulated for use in a certain way (e.g., Guyana television or Telugu Bibles), that is precisely to what it will be applied. Otherwise, we will apply financial gifts as needed. We covet your prayers and encouragement. We appreciate your generous donations. No gift is too small to make a difference – and no gift is too large to be useful in God's work through our hands.

Martha and I tentatively plan to be a part of the nationwide World Evangelism Media & Mission Workshops February 2022 in Guyana. We need your financial participation to permit that to occur. Logistics and corresponding funds need to be in place on the ground in Guyana not later than January. Perhaps your holiday gift-giving might extend to foreign evangelism, too.

# Eleven States in Fourteen Days

About 10:30 a.m. Thursday, September 23<sup>rd</sup>, we left Marietta for Chester, West Virginia and had a short visit with our friends Buck and Vera Groves. I had Louis stop for a few minutes so I could visit with Stan, Peggy and Rick Williams. The Groves and Williams are very good friends of mine.

Then, we went to Calcutta, Ohio, where we went to my late husband Bob's grave. The marker was very dirty and overgrown with grass, and so, we cleaned it and cut the grass. I put a small bouquet of flowers at the top of his marker. I only get to visit Bob's grave once a year at best. In December, Bob will have been gone six years. He left this evil world for a grand life. I miss him so very much. This in no means takes anything away from Louis, as he is the love of my life now.

We then met my son, Bryan for lunch. Of course, we had a short but good visit. I sure do miss seeing my children, grandchildren and great grandchildren. Most of them I did not get to see because it was a weekday.

It was about 4:00 p.m. before Louis and I headed to Jamestown, Pennsylvania. We visited with Martin and Mary Rushmore for a short while. We made plans for Thursday to go to Jamestown, New York to visit Louis and Martin's brother Larry.

The following day about lunchtime, we picked Larry up, and he guided us to a small hometown restaurant. The company and the food were great. We visited for about two hours before returning to Pennsylvania.

That afternoon on the way back form New York, we visited the gravesite of Louis' father. He died two years previously, but the pandemic prevented a funeral, and this was the first time Louis had been able to visit the grave.

Later that day, Martin, Mary, Louis and I visited with their other brother Michael and his wife Donna, who live outside of Jamestown, Pennsylvania. We had a good visit and, of course, it was a short visit, too. Michael is bedfast. It was then back to Martin's. We visited for a short while and went through some photographs and mementos Martin had saved for Louis after their dad's passing. Then, we went back to our motel.

The four of us made plans to go to the Linesville Spillway on the Pymatuning Reservoir the next morning. Martin and Mary's daughter Sammie came with us. We took lots of bread to feed the fish, the ducks and the seagulls. It was an enjoyable time. If you throw pieces of bread into the air, the seagulls catch it while in flight.

Not far from there, we all visited the Linesville Cemetery, where Louis showed his brother Martin and us various sections in which Rushmore ancestors are buried. Martin was



unaware of this part of their family history – and so close to them, too.

It was lunchtime, so we went to a country restaurant before parting from Martin and Mary. The food at this little family restaurant, out from town and surrounded by fields and woods, was very good. We were all surprised to find such a jewel in the middle of nowhere and virtually empty.

We were off again, and this time we went to the home of Ron and Janie Beadnell in Kensington, Ohio. They were our *bed and breakfast*, so to speak. On Sunday, Louis taught class and preached for the Hanoverton, Ohio Church of Christ. After church, Ron, Janie, Louis and I went to the Class of 50's diner in Minerva, Ohio. As usual the food and company were great.

Then, we were off on another leg of our trip to the home of my son Bob and his wife Sharon for supper. The best thing about going there, I got to see and play with my two-month-old great granddaughter. She is so adorable. We took a picture of the four generations. 
