This trip, the group prepared the mailing of Betty's newsletter, assisted with our newsletter, cleaned, pulled weeds, made some minor maintenance repairs, labeled boxes of books in preparation for overseas shipment and moved boxes in the warehouse, making space for an upcoming book delivery. Even though they could only stay about four hours, much work was accomplished.

Obadiah Doka, a Nigerian preacher, stopped by with Kathy Segars from the West President Church of Christ in Greenwood, MS. His praise of this magazine makes the hard work involved in getting it ready for the printer worthwhile. They arrived just after we unloaded a tractor-trailer loaded with three pallets of books and Volume 64 of *Voice of Truth International*. We jokingly chided them for the perfect timing.

Gene and Madolyn Gibson and Gene Hill brought Brother Hill's son and daughter-in-law by for a visit. This young couple, along with their two-year-old son, lives and works in China with the China Now program. They talked about their work in China and picked out some books for use in their work.

Other visitors included Joe and Bonnie Ruiz who work with the Spanish community through the West President congregation in Greenwood, MS. The Ruiz family also makes trips to Peru. Since our last report, we have visited congregations in KY, AL, MS, TN and FL. The trip to Florida was our third since the first of the year. One congregation in AL is almost to GA, and while in that area, we spent a few extra days near Chattanooga so that Louis could tape some lessons for GBN.

Pulpit in Sevierville, TN. Louis and I each taught three lessons to the 6-9 year-olds. The children love Louis' map class and on occasion will tell their parents, "There's the map man!" I taught PowerPoint lessons about the Christian Armor, Youthful Servants of God and Bible Geography Jeopardy (based on the material Louis taught). The children were wonderful, well behaved and they and we had a lot of fun together. When we were not teaching, we tended the display for World Evangelism with an emphasis on our work and the books for sale by Choate/Rushmore Publications, and we attended several excellent lessons. This week is a time for spiritual refreshment, renewing friendships and making new friends. Frequently, a couple would speak to us and ask if we remembered them. Many times, I would have to beg forgiveness and ask their names. Most of the time once the name was given, I would remember we stayed in their home or we had a meal out together. I can usually remember a face, but putting a name with the face is a struggle for me. If you are one of the ones I forgot, please forgive me.

Following the weeklong spiritual feast at Polishing the Pulpit, we took a five-day vacation in a quiet cabin outside of Pigeon Forge, TN in the Smoky Mountains. We spent time relaxing and enjoying the scenery and went to two dinner shows (a treat for us, as this is something we have never done before). Back at the cabin, I worked on the last lesson of my book, *Living Principles: Gleanings from Unnamed and Named Bible Characters*. With the last chapter written, I need to reread it for consistency since I started this book three years ago while we were living in West Virginia. My goal is to have it completed,

ready for the printer by the end of the year. Louis worked on *Gospel Gazette Online* and our September newsletter. On our way home, we stopped at Clingman's Dome (one of the highest points in the Appalachian Mountains) and hiked the half-mile to the top.
